Approved List of Plants

Homeowners must comply with the requirements in the Las Haciendas Architectural Control Guidelines and Rules, Regulations & Guidelines for any plantings within the limits of their property Lot lines. Planting of any vegetation on Common Area property by residents is NOT permitted. The plants listed below are approved for appropriate drought-tolerant species that perform well in our climate. Other plant species are acceptable provided they are low water and drought-tolerant.

TREES

Should a Homeowner wish to replace or plant a tree within their Lot lines they must complete an Architectural Change Request and submit to the Management Company for Architectural Control Committee review and Board approval.

FLOWERS

Annual and perennial flowers of any type that are suitable for desert landscapes and have minimal water requirements

CACTUS

Cactus plants must be situated in an enclosed area within Homeowner’s Lot line in the back yard to protect children and pets.

TURF
